# Our Curriculum

At Worle Village, we provide a curriculum that revolves around the children's interests whilst still ensuring National Curriculum coverage. We have taken the time to create engaging, inspiring topics that increase children's curiosity and make them ask big questions that expand their thinking and develop them across all subjects.

Our curriculum is run on a 2-year rolling programme so year groups have opportunities to work together and allows for all areas to be covered. They include 'WOW' days that give children first hand experiences to extend and enrich their learning and encourage children to become experts in their field of study.



In the last few years we have seen explorers take to the woods, travels into giant maps, visits from people from the past, evacuees fleeing from WW2 bombs, experiencing life in a trench, excavating fossils, building Tudor houses, finding Roman coins, becoming Victorians, celebrating black history, creating Arabic tales, making volcanoes and hosting our own VE day. And that is only the beginning...

We are a 'Learning without Limits' school and therefore endeavour to involve the children in their learning. At the end of each term they help us to plan for the next term. Providing their ideas, questions and topics they want to know more about. Then we fit the curriculum around this allowing for learning with enjoyment so children develop a 'love for learning!'

Our achievement of heritage school's status shows our commitment to ensuring children have a grasp of the past not just further afield but within their own communities so they can understand how things came to be and where they stand within it. A sense of identity is essential to a child's well-being.

We have begun embedding philosophy into the curriculum, which research shows improves children's overall achievement. It allows for critical thinking and analysis while developing acceptance of others views and opinions. Children develop skills to work collaboratively and explore their world.



## The School Day

We try to encourage all of our pupils to walk, scoot, cycle, or park and stride to school, with an appropriate adult, whenever possible.

We hold a Platinum Modeshift Stars Award and are the only school in North-Somerset to hold this prestigious level. Each month the children get the opportunity to achieve a WOW Badge for their active travel to school.

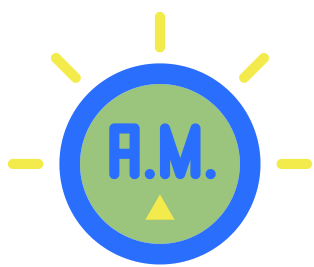
If you do need to drive to school then you can park at Hill Rd East car park for free and walk up through the churchyard. This counts as active travel for the pupils to achieve their badges.

Upper Key Stage 2 Children (year 5 and 6) can walk, scoot or cycle independently, if agreed with the Headteacher. Forms for walking to school independently can be found on our website or obtained by contacting the school office.

**If for any reason you cannot park in the car park please observe the following: -**

- Do NOT park on the zigzag or double yellow lines. Our gates are positioned on a corner and any obstructions can impede a pedestrian's view, endangering our children and parents.
- Please park considerately (not across peoples drives or on the pavement) and legally.
- We are visited by the local Community Police Officers who will issue parking tickets and warning letters.

# The School Day



To get the best from school, children need to arrive punctually. The school gates will be open from 8:35am.

At 8:40am the bell will ring for KS2: Kingfisher, Penguin, Robin and Puffin classes will line up and then be welcomed into their classroom.

At 8:50am the bell will ring for EYFS & KS1: Bluebird and Flamingo classes will line up and then be welcomed into their classroom.

*What happens if you are running late? Take your child to the office to be registered.*

*Please call the school office by 9.30am if your child will be attending school after the above times.*

## Playtime

Children need time to have fun, play and be active! Unless the weather is really poor, we will always try and have outside playtime.



Children will require a warm coat during the Autumn, Winter and Spring terms and a raincoat in the Summer term. Gloves, hats, scarfs and sun caps can also be worn as appropriate, but please ensure every item is labelled with your child's name.

In the Summer term, please apply sun cream to your child before school. Break times will vary depending on the year of the class and start from approximately 10am to 11:15am.

Children in EFYS and KS1 receive a free snack of fruit provided for them. KS2 children are welcome to bring a piece of fruit in with them for their snack.

The school gates open at 15:10pm for children to be collected at 15:15pm. If you have arranged for someone else to collect your child, please let the school office know.

# Communication

## SEND Provision

At Worle Village Primary School, we understand that some students may benefit from specialized intervention and support through our Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) provision.

We are committed to creating an inclusive environment where every child's individual and unique needs are recognized and supported. Whether it's helping with learning, behavior, social-emotional development, or physical and medical needs, we are here to ensure that every child has the opportunity to thrive.

Our SENCO, in collaboration with you as parents and carers, along with your child's class teacher, coordinates all additional support for students with SEND. Every member of the Worle Village team is dedicated to providing high-quality education for all our children. This includes offering differentiated tasks, facilitating small group work with adult support, or providing a personalized curriculum tailored to individual needs. Occasionally, students may need to work in a focused setting outside of the classroom for specific interventions that support their learning and we are always ready to seek additional support and guidance from external agencies when necessary. We have two dedicated spaces: a room with our Learning Mentor and the Rainbow Room.



## Attendance

At our school, we love to celebrate our pupils' achievements, and attendance plays a huge part in helping them reach their full potential. That's why we encourage and promote 100% attendance for all our pupils.

Our goal is to meet the national attendance target, and we know that with your help, we can achieve it together.

We understand how important regular attendance is for your child's success, and we're here to support you every step of the way. We value the partnership we have with our parents and believe that strong communication between home and school is key. If there's ever a concern about your child's attendance, we'll reach out to you and work together to find a solution.

We know that sometimes life can present challenges that affect attendance, but we're committed to working with you, your child, and the Education Welfare Services to overcome any obstacles as quickly as possible. Our aim is to support every pupil in maintaining full attendance so they can make the most of their time at school.

## Holidays

If you plan to take your child on holiday during term time, please complete a holiday request form, available from the school office. Please note, we do not authorise holidays during term time except in extreme circumstances. The Educational Welfare Officer closely monitors any unauthorised absences and will issue penalty notices if more than five days are taken.

## What do I do if my child is ill?

We keep detailed records of each child's attendance and punctuality, which is monitored by the school and the educational welfare officer. If your child is unwell, please telephone the school office before 9.30am on the first day of your child's absence to inform us they will not be in school. The school will contact you if no communication has been made. If your child has a medical appointment, please inform the office and a form will need to be completed. A copy of the appointment card/letter will be requested.

# Wraparound Care

Our school has its own highly successful onsite wraparound care provision in the form of Breakfast and After School Clubs. The club is registered to provide childcare for children who attend Worle Village Primary School, during term-time.



## Breakfast Club

We are proud to be the only school in North Somerset taking part in the DfE's free Breakfast Club pilot scheme. We combine this with the paid element of our club so that children can come from 7.45am for a £2.00 fee, if parents need an earlier start, or from 8.10am under the free element. Children can choose from a range of cereals or toast, with occasional special or themed breakfasts. When the weather is good, they have the option to play outside; during wet weather, a variety of indoor activities are available in the hall.

The gates open for Breakfast Club at 7:45am, and children are taken to their classrooms in time for the start of the school day.

## After School Club

A healthy snack and drink is provided at After School Club and can range from crumpets, toast, wraps, crackers and ham or cheese, fruit, milk etc.

There are a range of activities on offer including crafts, games and sports. Homework and reading support is also provided.

After School Club sometimes run themed nights where normal activities are available but also a special interests events such as Minecraft nights, football tournament, movie nights and Mad Hatter Tea Parties.

Children are collected from their classrooms for After School Club and the latest collection time is 5:30pm.

The free Breakfast Club option is open to all pupils and After School Club can take a maximum of 30 pupils per session. All sessions, including the free club, have to be pre-booked and where payment is required, paid for in advance using School Gateway, we do not operate a credit facility. The only exception to this rule is for those parents who use childcare vouchers. For details of charges please refer to the wraparound care page on our website.
